COLLECT:

Almighty Father, whose Son was revealed in majesty before he suffered death upon the cross: give us grace to perceive his glory, that we may be strengthened to suffer with him and be changed into his likeness, from glory to glory; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

or

Holy God, you know the disorder of our sinful lives: set straight our crooked hearts, and bend our wills to love your goodness and your glory in Jesus Christ our Lord.

FIRST READINGS: 2 Corinthians 3.12-4.2

Since, then, we have such a hope, we act with great boldness, not like Moses, who put a veil over his face to keep the people of Israel from gazing at the end of the glory that was being set aside. But their minds were hardened. Indeed, to this very day, when they hear the reading of the old covenant, that same veil is still there, since only in Christ is it set aside. Indeed, to this very day whenever Moses is read, a veil lies over their minds; but when one turns to the Lord, the veil is removed. Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. And all of us, with unveiled faces, seeing the glory of the Lord as though reflected in a mirror, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another; for this comes from the Lord, the Spirit.

Therefore, since it is by God's mercy that we are engaged in this ministry, we do not lose heart. We have renounced the shameful things that one hides; we refuse to practise cunning or to falsify God's

word; but by the open statement of the truth we commend ourselves to the conscience of everyone in the sight of God.

GOSPEL READING: Luke 9.28-36

Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah'—not knowing what he said. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, 'This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!' When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.

POST COMMUNION PRAYER:

Holy God, we see your glory in the face of Jesus Christ: may we who are partakers at his table reflect his life in word and deed, that all the world may know his power to change and save. This we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord.

COMPLINE FOR LENT. Lent is a season for preparing, for giving up things and for taking on new things so we can grow in our relationship with God. Whatever way we observe Lent, prayer ought to be at the heart of our journey. So, for the season of Lent (except for Holy Week when there will be lots of other things on) we are going to have a Compline service on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays at 5pm. In monasteries, compline was the last service of the day, it is a lovely short and reflective service, and it's by some described as 'the liturgical equivalent of being tucked into bed' (though instead of bed you may prefer dinner first!). In this service we will read through (most of) the Book of Exodus, and every day will have its own Psalm. Tuesdays (Psalm 130), Thursday (Psalm 51) because they are appropriate penitential psalms, and Friday Psalm 22 so we can be reminded every Friday of Christ's suffering, as Jesus prays this psalm on the cross, My God, My God, Why have you forsaken me? No need to sign up, young and old are all welcome to just turn up at the church, or do this at home (ask Erik for the reading plan if you'd like it).

<u>CONFIRMATION CLASSES</u> If you or your child would like to make a deeper commitment to the Christian faith, why not join for our

confirmation classes that will start just after Easter? Or if you'd just like to explore questions around faith but are not quite sure yet if you'd like to do confirmation, you are most welcome to come along as well! We are planning sessions for teenagers (Wednesday evening 7pm) and for adults (Tuesday evening 8pm), and the Confirmation service is planned for Sunday 15th of June at 3pm.
